Planning Process Overview

The strategic plan will be complemented by a 5-year operating and financial plan, which has been developed over the past few months in interaction with the community.

- Strategic planning is a core element of ICANN's three-fold planning process cycle:
 - 5-year Strategic Plan
 - 5-year Operating and Financial Plan
 - Annual Operating Plan & Budget
- Process of developing an operational and financial plan may lead to calibration of the strategic plan, in terms of "realistic ambitions"
- Planning cycle ends with ongoing achievements and progress reporting






Planning Documents and Timeline

FY21- FY25 Strategic Plan (SP) outlines ICANN's Vision and Mission, sets out five strategic objectives and related goals based on areas of challenge and opportunity for ICANN to shape its future successfully.

FY21-FY25 Operating & Financial Plan (O&FP) includes 1) Financial assumptions and high-level projection of the "base-case", "high" and "low" funding scenarios for FY21-FY25, and 2) ICANN org will undertake existing and new activities to achieve the strategic outcome set out in the FY21-FY25 Strategic Plan.

FY21 Operating Plan & Budget (OP&B) sets forth the focus of efforts and organizational commitments for the current fiscal year.





FY21-25 Operating & Financial Plan Overall Process and Approach



Approach



The FY21-25 Operating & Financial Plan (O&FP) will include initiatives driven by the Strategic Plan and description of the strategically driven changes of the functional activities.



Strategically Focused on what ICANN should do and reexamine what ICANN should change.



Focus on **High-Level** rather than losing the main messages to too much details.




Highlight **Collaboration** Cross-Functionally & with the Community

Aligning Plan Structure




- Combined 5 Year and 1 Year

 - Description of Functional Activities planned and a focus on anticipated changes to current activities









Excerpt of Marketplace Horizon Scan Finding

"The continued importance of controlling a domain name to craft and maintain a digital presence on the global Internet remains a key market enabler of the industry..."



Formulation of Assumptions (Qualitative)

Digital presence will still rely largely on the use of domain names. Domain name transaction volumes will accordingly continue to see positive growth momentum over the forecast period, albeit at varying levels, at the 'base-case' and 'high' funding scenarios. To account for rapid maturation in the marketplace, the 'low' scenario factors an overall decline in transaction volumes...



Macro View of Funding: Actual & Forecast (FY14-FY25)





5-Year Funding Forecast: Low – Base Case – High Scenarios

 Across the three scenarios generated, FY25 funding is forecast to range between \$120.9M and \$167.7M from the current FY20 projection of \$139.3M.

Planning Assumptions

- ICANN organization's activities and projects result directly or indirectly from Bylaws requirements, and from decisions made by the Board based on community-led policies or recommendations
 - At this time, we are not including implementation work from future Board decisions that have yet to be approved
 - The Five-Year Plan will include contingency funding for unplanned work that has yet to be approved
- The Five-year plan will use the base scenario funding projections
- The Five-year plan will include a planned annual contribution to the Reserve Fund
- Headcount is expected to remain relatively stable
- The Five-year plan will be a balanced budget where expenses plus a planned contribution to the reserve fund will not exceed funding



- The projections define the maximum amount of operational expenses to be incurred on an annual basis
 - This results in the available funding net of an annual allocation to the Reserve Fund.
 - The Reserve Fund allocation is designed to enable the Reserve Fund balance to reach the minimum target level of 12 months of Operating expenses by the end of the plan period (FY25).

- Each Function includes the Departments and Regions within each Executive's area.
- Projects are also included in the Activities of the Executives who lead the Projects

Operating Initiatives

- Operating Initiatives derived based on the Strategic Objectives and Goals.
- Each Operating Initiatives is led by an Executive collaborating with several crossfunctional teams



Strategic Objectives and Operating Initiatives

Strengthen the security of the Domain Name System and the DNS Root Server System

- Promote Domain Name System Security Extensions and increase its deployment
- Coordinate security in the DNS ecosystem

Improve the effectiveness of ICANN's multistakeholder model of governance

- Evolve and strengthen the multistakeholder model to facilitate diverse and inclusive participation in policy-making
- Evolve and strengthen the ICANN community's decision-making processes to ensure efficient and effective policy making
- Develop internal and external ethics policies
- Review and evaluate current meeting strategy

Address geopolitical issues impacting ICANN's mission to ensure a single, globally interoperable Internet

- Evaluate, align and facilitate improved engagement in the Internet ecosystem
- Improve engagement and participation with Government, Intergovernmental Organizations
- Monitor legislation, regulation, norms, principles and initiatives in collaboration with others that may impact the ICANN mission



Strategic Objectives and Operating Initiatives (cont)

- Evolve the unique identifier systems in coordination and collaboration with relevant parties to continue to serve the needs of the global Internet user base
 - Formalize a framework for further cooperation and coordination among the domain name, Internet numbers, and protocol parameter communities on risks associated with the evolution of the Internet's system of unique identifiers Coordinate security in the DNS ecosystem
 - Root Zone Management Evolution
 - Promote and sustain a competitive environment in the Domain Name System
- Ensure ICANN's long-term financial sustainability
 - Formalize the ICANN org funding model and improve understanding of the long-term drivers of the domain name marketplace
 - Implement New gTLD Auction Proceeds recommendations
 - Planning at ICANN



FY21 Operating Plan and Budget Process

- The annual planning process is stable and follows a similar timeline as last year
- Annual Timeline
 - The timing of the Public Comment period for the Draft FY21 Operating Plan and Budget publication has been coordinated with the FY21-FY25 Five Year Operating Plan public comment period.
 - The adoption of the FY21 Operating Plan and Budget is similar to FY20 Process
 - Board approval well in advance of the next fiscal year
 - Empowered community process (28 days) before the start of the next fiscal year
- Timing of Approval for SO/AC Additional Budget Requests
 - Current process results in approval at the same time as overall Board approval



Key Changes-Improved Structure and Transparency

- We have improved our reporting and project structure to increase transparency and visibility regarding key information and initiatives
 - Last year we posted 5 documents for the annual budget and 5 year plan update, this year we will post 4 documents
 - In the past, we provided transparency into all activities and projects
 - This year, we have narrowed our focus to reduce complexity and improve the transparency regarding key initiatives and projects




